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


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OPERATING RIGHTS

The rates and provision named in this Tariff, or as amended, are limited in their application in Ohio Intrastate commerce to the extent of the operating rights set fourth below:

Transportation of property from and to points in Ohio

RESTRICTED to the transportation of household goods and office furniture.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

BASIS OF WEIGHT

- (a) The tare weight of each vehicle used in transportation of household goods shall be determined by having it weighed prior to the transportation of each shipment, without the crew thereon, by a certified weigh master or on a certified scale, and when so weighed, the gasoline tank on each vehicle shall be full and the vehicle shall contain all blankets, pads, chains, dollies, and hand trucks needed in the transportation of such shipment.
- (b) After the vehicle has been loaded, it shall be weighed, without the crew thereon, prior to the delivery of the shipment and the net weight shall be determined by deducting the tare weight from the loaded weight, except that in instances where no adequate scale is located at origin or destination or at any point within a radius of 5 miles there from or at any point en route from point of origin to destination where scales are known to exist, a constructive weight, based on 7 pounds per cubic foot of properly loaded van space, may be used. The gross weight, tare weight, and net weight of the constructive weight shall be shown on the Bill of Lading and freight bill or Combined Uniform Household Goods Bill of Lading and Freight Bill.
- © In the transportation of part loads, this Rule shall apply in all respects, except that the gross weight of a vehicle containing one or more part loads may be used as the tare weight of such vehicle as to part loads subsequently loaded thereon, and a part load for any one shipper not exceeding 1,000 pounds, may be weighed on a certified scale prior to being loaded on a vehicle, such part load to be accompanied by a weight ticket evidencing such weight.

COMPUTATION OF DISTANCE

- (a) Distance shall be computed by the shortest highway routes and shall be ascertained by compilation of distances as shown in the current issue of the Ohio Transportation Map, issued by the Ohio Department of Transportation from point of destination.
- (b) For distances from any point of origin to any point of destination not shown on the Map referred to above, the actual odometer reading of the vehicle used via the shortest practical route shall be used, except that the Map shall be used for such portions of the distance as may be provided thereon or ascertainable therefrom.
- © When at the request of the shipper a longer route than the shortest practical route is used or when specified routes are designated by any federal, state, county, township, or municipal authority over which the shipment must be transported, the distance over such routes shall apply.
- (d) Fractions of one mile shall be increased to the next whole mile.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

CLAIMS

- (a) Any claim for loss, damage, or overcharge shall be in writing. As a condition precedent to any claim adjustment or payment, said claim shall be accompanied by the original paid bill for transportation and original Bill of Lading, if not previously surrendered to the carrier. Carrier may require certified or sworn statement of claim.
- (b) Carrier shall be immediately notified of all claims for concealed and/or external damage and shall be given reasonable opportunity to inspect alleged external damage or concealed damage in original package.
- (c) The carrier's liability shall not exceed the cost of repairing or replacing the property lost or damaged with materials of like kind and quality not exceeding the actual cash value of the property at time and place of loss, with due allowance for depreciation or deterioration however caused, but in no event to exceed the release value as determined under Declaration of Value, Page 5 & 6.
- (d) The carrier shall not be liable for loss or damage occurring after the property has been delivered to or received for by the consignee or shipper, or the authorized agent of either. When the carrier is directed to unload or to deliver property (or render any service) at a place or places at which the consignee or its agent is not present, the property shall be at the risk of the owner after unloading or delivery.
- (e) Where the carrier is directed to load property from (or render any services at) a place or places at which the consignor or its agent is not present, the property shall be at the risk of the owner before loading.
- (f) The carrier's liability with regard to sets or matched pieces shall be limited to repair or replacement of the lost or damaged piece or pieces only and shall not extend to repair, replacement or recovering of the entire set, but in no event to exceed the released value as determined under Declaration of Value, Page 5 & 6.
- (g) **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF CLAIMS:**
Carrier, upon receipt of a written claim for loss or damage to property transported by it, shall acknowledge receipt of such claim, in writing, to the claimant within 15 calendar days after its receipt by the carrier or the carrier's agent. The carrier shall, at the time such claim is received, cause the date of receipt to be recorded on the claim.
- (h) **CLAIM HANDLING BY CARRIER:**
Carrier will pay, decline, or make a firm compromise settlement offer in writing to the claimant within 60 days after receipt of the claim by the carrier or its agent, provided, that if the claim cannot be processed and disposed of within 60 days after the receipt thereof, the carrier shall at that time and the expiration of each succeeding 30 day period, advise the claimant in writing of the status of the claim and the disposition thereof.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

DECLARATION OF VALUE

- (a) As used in this Tariff, the phrases "Released Value" and "Value Declared by the Shipper" shall have the same meaning.
- (b) Shipments for which weight is the basis of charges and are subject to rates as set forth in Section 2, the carrier's maximum liability shall be either (1) \$2.25 times the actual weight in pounds of the shipment or the declared lump sum value, whichever is greater; or (2) 60 cents per pound for the actual weight of any lost or damaged article or articles, if the shipment has been expressly released by the shipper to such value per article. Unless the shipper expressly releases the shipment to a value not exceeding 60 cents per pound per article, the carrier's maximum liability for loss and damage shall be either the lump sum value declared by the shipper or an amount equal to \$2.25 for each pound of weight in the shipment, whichever is greater. Such liability to be governed by Claims, Paragraph ©, page 4.
- © The released value must be entered on the Bill of Lading in the following form and may be completed only by the person signing the Bill of Lading:

Shipper hereby releases the entire shipment to a value not exceeding:

NOTICE: The shipper signing this contract must in the space above in his own handwriting insert either his declaration of the actual value of the shipment or the words "Depreciated Value Protection Requested" or "60 cents per pound per article" otherwise, the shipment will be deemed released to a maximum value equal to \$2.25 times the weight of the shipment in pounds.

- (d) If the shipper fails to make the entry required in Subsection © of this Item, the shipment will be deemed released to an amount equal to \$2.25 times the actual weight of the shipment in pounds.
- (e) Shipments for which time is the basis of charges and are subject to rates as set forth in Hourly Rates, the carrier's maximum liability shall be 60 cents per pound per article or the declared lump sum value and must be entered on the Bill of Lading in the following form and may be completed only by the person signing the Bill of Lading:

DECLARATION OF VALUE

- (f) If the shipper fails to make the entry required in Paragraph (e) above, the shipment will be deemed to be released at 60 cents per pound per article. Shipments moving under rates named in Hourly Rates, Page 6, shall not be subject to provision of the Tariff or Bill of Lading relating to minimum or maximum values determined by multiplying the weight of the shipment by \$2.25 for each pound.

DEFINITION OF "SHIPMENT"

The term "shipment" means property tendered by one shipper, and accepted by the carrier, at one place of origin, at one time, for one consignee, at one destination and covered by one Bill of Lading. The name of only one shipper and one consignee shall appear on one Bill of Lading, but the Bill of Lading may also specify the name of a party to notify of the arrival of the shipment at the destination.

EXTRA LABOR

Except as otherwise provided, rates published in this Tariff include the loading and unloading of freight into and out of carrier's vehicle and the services of two men, (driver and helper). Where additional labor is necessary to load or unload freight which cannot be handled by the two men, (driver and helper), such labor will be furnished by the carrier. Such additional labor will be provided by the carrier at an additional charge of \$25.00 per man per hour.

HOURLY RATES

Charges based on time shall be computed by multiplying the hourly rate by the time involved. Fractions of an hour will be disposed of as follows:

When the time involved is less than 15 minutes, the charge shall be for one quarter of an hour. When time is in excess of 15 minutes, but not more than 30 minutes, the charge shall be for one half hour. When time is in excess of 30 minutes, but not more than 45 minutes, the charge shall be for three quarters of one hour. When the time is in excess of 45 minutes, but not more than one hour, the charge shall be for one hour.

MAXIMUM CHARGE

The total transportation charge on any shipment shall not exceed the charge as would apply on the same shipment under the next greater unit of weight at rates applicable to such next greater unit of weight.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

MINIMUM WEIGHTS AND ACTUAL WEIGHTS

- (a) The minimum charges on any one shipment shall be 1000 lbs at applicable rate.
- (b) An Order of Service for Transportation of a shipment weighing less than the minimum weight shown on Page 6 in the Table of Minimum Weights will be accepted and shipment will be transported at the rate and charges applicable to the actual weight of the shipment subject to Paragraph (a) of Minimum Weights and Actual Weights, conditioned that the actual loading and delivery of shipment shall be made on no specific date, but at the convenience of the carrier.

PAYMENTS

- (a) The carrier will not deliver or relinquish possession of any property transported by it until all tariff rates and charges thereon have been paid in cash, money order (other than personal money order), traveler's check, cashier's check, bank treasurer's check, or certified check, except where other satisfactory arrangements have been made between the carrier and the consignor or consignee.
- (b) When satisfactory arrangements for credit have been made between the carrier and the consignee or consignor, the following conditions will apply:
 - (1) The free credit period shall extend 15 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal Holidays (see note), from the first 12:00 midnight following the presentation of the bill by the carrier or deposit of same in the U.S. Mail. In case of dispute as to the time of mailing, the postmark shall be accepted as showing such time.
 - (2) When carrier's bill has not been paid within the free credit period, credit shall automatically be extended to a total of 30 calendar days, which shall include the free credit period, and shipper will be assessed a service charge by the carrier equal to 1% of the amount of carrier's bill, subject to a \$10.00 minimum charge for such extension of credit.
 - (3) Carrier's bill will state separately, the total charges due during both the free credit period and the extended credit period.
 - (4) The mailing by shipper of valid check, drafts, or money orders, in payment of charges within the credit period allowed such shipper, is deemed to be the collection of the tariff charges within the credit period for the purpose of this Payment Term. In case of dispute as to the time of mailing, the postmark shall be accepted as showing such time.
- © Nothing herein shall limit the right of the carrier to require at the time of or before shipment, the prepayment in part or in full of all charges for services requested by the shipper, consignee or agents of same.

NOTE: The days on which the following holidays are observed will be considered legal holidays: New Year's Day, President's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

SERVICING SPECIAL ARTICLES

The transportation rates in this tariff do not include servicing of articles or appliances such as refrigerators, deep freeze cabinets, radios, record players, washing machines, television sets, air conditioners and the like which, if not properly serviced, may be damaged in, or incident to, transit; nor is liability assumed for any such damage unless said articles, or appliances, are serviced as provided below:

- (a) Upon request of shipper, owner or consignee of the goods, carrier will, subject to (b) below, service such articles and appliances at origin and destination for the additional charge provided in Section 1, Additional Services. Such servicing does not include removal or installation of articles secured to the premises; or plumbing, electrical or carpentry services necessary to disconnect, remove, connect, and install such articles and appliances.
- (b) If carrier does not possess the qualified personnel to properly service such articles or appliances, carrier will, upon request of shipper, owner or consignee, and as agent for them, engage third parties to perform the servicing. When third parties are engaged by the carrier to perform any service, the carrier will not assume responsibility for their activities or conduct, the amount of their charges, nor for the quality of service furnished. Charges for the arrangement of such services will be found in Appliance Servicing, page 13.

COMMODITY DESCRIPTION

The description of property to which rates, rules, and regulations apply is that class of property designated by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio as a commodity under the following commodity description:

- (a) HOUSEHOLD GOODS. The term "Household Goods" means: Personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling.

ESTIMATES

- (a) BINDING ESTIMATE:
A binding written estimate is the actual cost of services for the move stated in the estimate (unless an addendum applies).
- (b) NON-BINDING ESTIMATE:
A non-binding written estimate shall be reasonably accurate and in accord with the carrier's tariff. The final charges on shipments moved after a non-binding estimate shall be determine by the carrier's tariff applicable to such transportation.
- © ADDENDUM:
Addendum is a supplement added to an estimate where the consignee or consignor makes changes to the original estimate.

Rates and charges apply without additional Valuation Charges when shipment is released to a value not exceeding 60 cents per pound per article. When shipment is NOT released to a value not exceeding 60 cents per pound per article, or shipper declares a valuation on the entire shipment, rates herein apply plus Valuation Charge name on page 14.

ELEVATOR OR STAIR CARRY CHARGES (Concluded)

NOTE 1: Elevator and stair carry charge will not apply when pickup or delivery is within a single family dwelling.

NOTE 2: Charges will be based on actual weight of the shipment, except as follows:

- (a) When under the provision of Table of Minimum, Page 6, portions of the shipment are picked up or delivered at more than one place, the charges will apply only to the ground floor or carried an excessive distance.

NOTE 3: Where an elevator is used and shipment must then be transferred to a second elevator or carried one or more flights, charges will be made once for the first elevator and again for each addition elevator or stair carry service.

NOTE 4: When stairs and elevators both are available, charge will be based on the method which result in the lower cost to the shipper.

NOTE 5: Inside a building, the first flight shall consist of at least 8 steps. Additional flights shall be defined as the number of complete floors above or below the first flight.

NOTE 6: Outside a building, the first flight shall consist of 8 steps but not more than 20 steps. Steps less than 8 will not be considered a flight.

NOTE 7: An extra carry means each carriage of 50 feet, or fraction thereof, after the first 75 feet (not including elevator or stair distance for which charges herein apply) between the vehicle and:

- (a) The entrance door of a detached or single family dwelling or,
- (b) The applicable individual apartment or office entrance door within a multiple occupancy building.

NOTE 8: When a piano, organ, and/or safe is included in a shipment, the handling charge for pianos, organs, or safe provided in Piano, Organ, or Safe Carry Charges, Page 12, will be in addition to the applicable charges in this section.

VALUATION CHARGES

On all shipments expressly released to a value exceeding 60 cents per pound per article, the following charges will apply:

ON ALL SHIPMENTS MOVING SUBJECT TO DECLARATION OF VALUE, PAGE 5, PARAGRAPH (e):

For each \$100.00, or fraction thereof, of released or declared value, 75 cents per each \$100.00.

Valuation charges provided for in this item at a minimum charge of \$22.20 (\$3,000 coverage) per service will apply unless shipper expressly releases the shipment to a value not exceeding 60 cents per pound per article.
